In the latter instance it is also used as a halter. It is not intended to be used as a stable halter in garrison, but should be kept by the trooper to whom issued on the peg with the rest of his equipment. A stable halter is provided for stable and corral use in garrison, and the bridle can thus always be kept presentable. The bridle consists of the following essential parts: A cheek piece, which is a plain strap of 94 1/2 to 101 1/2 ounce bridle leather 1 inch wide and 78 inches long. This strap passes twice over the head of the horse, thus forming a long loop on each side of the head. At the bottom point of each of these loops the noseband...
